About the Ministry

OVERVIEW

Our community appreciates hearing and learning about tools for spiritual growth. We love Unity teachings and also enjoy learning about other religions and their teachings. We attract people from many different spiritual backgrounds and invite them to participate and grow with us in whatever way spirit calls to them.

We currently provide in-person Sunday services that are also aired live on Zoom. Our Prayer Chaplain program includes a monthly call to every member. The Prayer Chaplains do not offer counseling, but rather encourage members to request a prayer based on what is of concern, needs healing, an affirmation or denial, or simply gratitude. We also have an active Care Team that delivers food to members in need, walks dogs for people, shops, and occasionally provides rides to Dr. visits.

What makes Unity Spiritual Center in the Rockies special?

Our people. Our community has a strong core membership comprised of people who have been members for a decade or more. We are dedicated to our spiritual study and our spiritual center.

Our building. The mortgage was paid in full in 2020. We have no debt and have a small reserve fund for emergencies and priorities.

Our history. We celebrated our 100th anniversary in 2022. This church was originally founded in Colorado Springs in 1922 and known as the Home of Truth.

Our practicality. One of our goals is to provide the knowledge and spiritual practices that can be used to make one's life better. We want our new minister to offer classes, workshops, ceremonies, and special events to support this goal.

Our sacred service. We provide strong support to local charitable organizations. For example, Westside Cares, an organization that serves our side of town. They provide services to disadvantaged people in need of food, clothing, medical care, and other supplies. We look for ways to help others.

Our open-mindedness. We welcome people of all religions, lifestyles, ages, and economic situations. We are affirming of choice. We invite guest speakers who help us see and understand more of the variety of ways people experience life.

Locality: Colorado Springs, Colorado

Physical Description: Colorado Springs area is home to diverse groups of people, as well as serving as home to 5 military installations and hosting several Universities including Colorado College, Pikes Peak State College, University of Colorado at Colorado Springs (UCCS) and the Air Force Academy. Colorado Springs had an estimated population of 492,088 in 2024, and a metro population of approximately 771,938, making it Colorado's second most populous city behind Denver. It sits at the

base of Pikes Peak, one of the most famous mountains in the Americas. (The song "America the Beautiful" was inspired by our mountain!) In 2020, Colorado Springs ranked #13 on the New York Times 52 Places to Go list and #10 in TripAdvisor's Top 25 Trending Destinations. In 2020-21, *U.S. News* ranked Colorado Springs #6 among the 25 Best Places to Live in the U.S. The Metropolitan Policy Program at Brookings found that Colorado Springs was the fastest-growing city for millennials. There are over 55 notable attractions. A few of these include Garden of the Gods (voted as one of the top 10 parks in the country), Cheyenne Mountain Zoo, U.S. Air Force Academy, Olympic Training Center, U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Museum, Pikes Peak (trail and road), Manitou Incline, and numerous hiking and biking trails. You can also go to *www.visitcos.com* for more information on the area.

Proximity to Other Unity Ministries and/or New Thought Centers:

We're the only Unity Spiritual Center in our city. We are located about 10 miles from a Center for Spiritual Living. There are four Unity churches in the Denver area, which is about 70 miles away. Colorado Springs is generally viewed as politically conservative but is "purple" in its voting practices. We are located on the westside of the city, which is more progressive and also the "historic" side of town. As demographics and viewpoints evolve, we believe more people are attracted to what newthought perspectives can bring to their lives. We are a Spiritual Center for those seekers.

This program is on hold awaiting our new Minister who will lead us in decision-making about when and how to restart this program.

We currently have a part-time office Administrator (25 hours per week), a part-time bookkeeper, and an AV Technician, and we contract bi-monthly cleaning of our building to a cleaning company. All but the Administrator are independent contractors. We presently have an open position for a Music Director and have a search team dedicated to finding one.

What have been the three most important events in the history of your ministry?

- 1. The addition of a fundraising Bingo game. We began hosting Bingo in 2014 and it has consistently brought in between \$40,000 and \$55,000 per year every year since then. The dedicated team of people who run this game have a bit of a "church within the church" commitment to each other and how they support the community. They do an amazing job and are deeply appreciated.
- 2. We engaged in a building share for almost five years. Our partner was a Unitarian Universalist community. This ended when they decided to rejoin the UU church in the area that they originally split off from, and was a very successful income generating, community building, spiritual experiment. We learned a lot about what we want and what we don't want.
- 3. <u>In 2022, we celebrated the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Colorado Springs Spiritual Center.</u> We had a large gala celebration with several former ministers attending. It was a tribute to all the individuals from the past and in the present who have given of their time and talent to continually enrich our Spiritual Center

In the last 3 years, what activities/special events in the ministry were well attended/appreciated?

- A recent visit by the Drepung Gomang monks was well attended, seeing over 1000 visitors in 7 days. Our One-Hundred-Year Celebration was well attended by current and past members, Sound baths, Cacao ceremonies, and special concerts have also garnered healthy attendance. We have consistent participants for our small groups as well
- <u>Ceremonies throughout the year</u> such as the Burning Bowl on New Year's Eve, the White
 Stone Ceremony, the Water Blessing Ceremony, Winter Solstice Ceremony, and Christmas Eve
 have become an important part of what we do each year. Many of these events, as well as our
 Sunday sermons, are recorded and are on our website.

• In August of 2023, we celebrated the <u>60th Anniversary of Martin Luther King's 'I have a dream' speech</u> with special guest Rev. Dr. Nathaniel Granger who portrayed Dr. King for this extraordinary presentation. giving a moving rendition of MLK's speech.

What does the congregation want to accomplish in the next 3 years?

- Active integration of our new vision, mission and core values, which includes a better
 understanding of and implementation of our commitment to collaborate, be authentic with
 each other, be compassion, and innovate. We are committed to living into deeper co-creation
 with the divine through the study of synchro-divinity
- <u>Financial stability</u>. Like all spiritual centers, we are still recovering from changes resulting from the pandemic. We'd like to see an increase in both attendance and giving. We are exploring projected costs of maintenance for the building we own and evaluating whether we should continue to inhabit this space or consider something new. Our finance committee, in collaboration with our Temple Keepers, is working on this. (Temple Keepers are the people who take care of our "temple space" facilities repair, etc.)
- We want to grow the younger end of our demographic and create a youth and family ministry program in a new and innovative way as we have no real space for a Sunday youth gathering. This may involve summer camps, special kid's events, and community support of young people with needs in our city. We are also interested in opening to the wider LGBTQ+ community in new ways.

The median listing home price in Colorado Springs, CO was \$480K in June 2024, trending down -4% year-over-year. The median listing home price per square foot was \$223. The median home sold price was \$483.5K. As of August 2024, the average rent in Colorado Springs, CO is \$1,310 per month. For comparison, the national average rent price in the US is currently \$1,536/month, which means Colorado Springs rent prices are 15% lower than the national average. When you rent an apartment in Colorado Springs, you can expect to pay about \$1,109 per month for a studio, \$1,310 for a one-bedroom apartment, and around \$1,610 for a two-bedroom apartment. If you opt for a three-bedroom rental, you could pay \$2,028 or more. Colorado Springs, CO hosts 182 public schools rated good and higher by GreatSchools. You can also find 33 private and charter schools.
